In 1994 — **San Antonio BEST's** inaugural year — 12 schools, 250 students, and 60 mentors participated in the competition. We expect that in 2008, 32 schools, 500 students, and 100 mentors will participate.

San Antonio needs a future workforce interested in and trained for technical careers. San Antonio's current students need *you* to help them get there.



boosting engineering, science, & technology

Building tomorrow's leaders through teamwork and technology

All children are born scientists. They ask questions, they probe, they ask why and why not? Soon, however, this sense of wonder is snuffed out by textbooks and dry formulas. Science becomes a realm for nerds. Area volunteers are out to change that impression with a thrilling competition that's part science fair and part sports event.

Each fall, we provide around 32 area high schools with a box of random parts and supplies and a unique task. In six weeks, students, aided by adult mentors, design a remote-controlled robot that competes head-to-head against other designs in a rousing all-day competition. More than \$90,000 in scholarships and an invitation to compete statewide await the top finishers. This is **San Antonio BEST**; an effort committed to awakening young minds to the wonders and practicalities of technology.

People like you are at the heart of the program. Engineers, technicians, scientists, administrators, and others from the Air Intelligence Agency, Northrop Grumman, St. Mary's University, Southwest Research Institute, and other companies serve as role models to motivate students to do things they didn't think they could do - like design a robot, organize a team, win a competition, and become an engineer or scientist.

The robots compete head-to-head at the local contest held in October. On the day of the contest, mentors oversee repairs and modifications to the robots between matches. Meanwhile, cheerleaders, parents, and fellow students cheer their teams on to victory, until only the winners remain.

Even without a technical background, **San Antonio BEST** can use your skills year-round to help build and maintain its current program.
